Message from our Moderator - Fr. John Sebahar

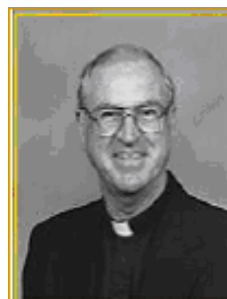

YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST**Diane Dow****Come to the Feast of Heaven and Earth**

Most of us are familiar with the joyful hymn of Daniel Schutte, "Come to the feast of heaven and earth! Come to the table of plenty! God will provide for all that we need, here at the table of plenty."

In his book, *The Lamb's Supper, The Mass as Heaven on Earth*, Scott Hahn reminds us that Pope John Paul II called the Mass "heaven on earth" because "the liturgy we celebrate on earth is a mysterious participation in the heavenly liturgy."

Hahn explains in his beautiful, easy flowing style that this concept of the Mass goes back to the time of St. John's Book of Revelation and continued throughout the history of the Church. The beauty and the symbolism of the Book of Revelation can be appreciated in relation to the liturgy we celebrate today. As he tells his story, much is familiar, and yet his explanations and connections to Revelation bring a new insight and depth to our rite of celebration of Eucharist as well as a renewed sense of gratitude and reverence for this Gift of Living Bread. He includes many references to Scripture, papal letters and the Catechism of the Catholic Church which can be used for clarification as well as for meditation and further study.

Only an infinitely loving God would make it possible for us to receive Him, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. This Bread of Life and Covenant of Love does make a difference. According to Hahn, "To go to Mass is to renew our covenant with God, as at a marriage feast—for the Mass is the marriage supper of the Lamb. As in a marriage, we take vows, we pledge ourselves, we assume a new identity. We are changed forever. To go to Mass is to receive the fullness of grace, the very life of the Trinity. No power in heaven or on earth can give us more than we receive in the Mass, for we receive God into ourselves."

In this Year of the Eucharist, I invite you to read *The Lamb's Supper*. It offers a wealth of opportunity for spiritual growth, and I guarantee you will participate at Mass with a greater appreciation for this awesome Feast of heaven and earth.

**KEYNOTE SPEAKER
BISHOP JOSEPH M SIEGEL, D.D.
AUXILIARY BISHOP OF JOLIET**

Bishop Siegel was born in Lockport Township and received his sacraments and attended school at the Cathedral of St. Raymond in Joliet. After graduating from St. Charles Borromeo High School, he studied at Joliet Junior College and then completed his college education at St. Meinrad Seminary in Indiana. He was then sent to the North American College in Rome for his theological studies, attending the Gregorian and the Angelicum Universities.

He was ordained a priest for the Joliet Diocese on March 4, 1988 and was assigned to St. Isidore Parish in Bloomingdale. While serving at St. Isidore, he completed his Licentiate in Sacred Theology at the University of St. Mary of the Lake in Mundelein. Parochial assignments include: St. Mary Immaculate in Plainfield, St. Mary Nativity in Joliet, the Cathedral of St. Raymond, and Pastor at Visitation Parish in Elmhurst. During these years, he also was involved in various diocesan boards and committees and served as a Dean and Director of Continuing Formation for Priests.

On October 28, 2009, Pope Benedict nominated Father Siegel as Auxiliary Bishop of Joliet and he was ordained a bishop at the Cathedral of St. Raymond by Bishop Sartain on January 19, 2010.

Greg will talk with us about the seven counties our Diocese covers, the changing community needs and the new challenges to Catholic Charities and other church service programs and how they are responding to these needs.

He will talk about how they design effective responses to the needs in the areas of children, the elderly, counseling, housing and homelessness across our wide geographic diversity. These programs include Daybreak Center, Counseling, Senior Programs, Children's Services and Early Childhood Services.

Greg will speak at the JDCCW Convention on Saturday, October 23, 2010; presentation begins at 3:30 p.m. and will end with a question and answer session.

Do you remember that old Christopher challenge, "You can change the world"? That is what the speaker in the Legislative Workshop will invite you to do. The title of Eric Scheidler's talk will be "The David and Goliath Battle: How YOU Can Be On the Winning Side." It is remarkable that he was able to rally hundreds of people to pray 24 hours a day for fifty two days at the site of the Planned Parenthood abortion mill which was built in Aurora, Illinois in 2007 under a cloud of deception and controversy. His experience in the many lawsuits involving the Planned Parenthood clinic and his knowledge learned in promoting legislation to protect women and their unborn children can be applied to any social or moral issue. He is no stranger to Springfield where he personally lobbied his elected representatives. He plans to show how each of us have a role to play in improving our society. No one is just a spectator.

Legislation touches so many aspects of our daily life that we have to be constantly vigilant. There are many wonderful websites to keep us informed. It really is our duty to know who our elected officials are and to let them hear from us on issues of concern to the common good of society and those that affect our Catholic values. Society seems to be reeling right now under the weight of so much unpopular legislation. Now is not the time to throw in the towel and give up.
