"Losing a Spouse, Building A Life" - featuring Matthew Kelly

The loss of a spouse can hit like a category 5 hurricane. No matter how much or how little preparation is done to evacuate to a spiritual and emotional high ground, lives are left in shambles. "A MINISTRY TO MARRIAGE" TRAINING ON FEBRUARY 25

On Saturday, February 25, Frank Hannigan will offer training in a marriage preparation program called A Ministry to Marriage. It entails two married couples working with a group of engaged couples for four evenings. The program is being used in parishes across the country, as well as locally.

Frank Hannigan is the director of the Chicago Office of Family Ministries with many years of leadership in Catholic marriage preparation and family ministry. He is an advisor to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Marriage and the Family.

The training will run from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., and the cost is \$20 per person, or \$30 per couple (sharing materials). Participants will receive both **A Marriage in the Lord**, a workbook that can be used in many different forms of marriage preparation, and **A Ministry to Marriage**, which describes the small group format.

FOCCUS TRAINING JANUARY 14 IN BOURBONNAIS

The FOCCUS Pre-Marital Inventory is part of the marriage preparation process for all engaged couples in the Joliet Diocese. Priests, deacons, and other parish staff members, as well as parish-approved and trained lay couples, may use FOCCUS with engaged couples.

A one-day training for FOCCUS will take place on **Saturday, January 14** at Maternity Parish in Bourbonnais, which is just north of Kankakee. The training, which runs from 9:00 to 3:00, will cost \$10.00 per person (Maternity Parish has made separate arrangements for its own participants). Those who need the FOCCUS materials will be able to purchase the \$35.00 Facilitator Manual on that day. The \$15.00 hand-scoring package will also be available. ANNULMENT FIELD ADVOCATE TRAINING

Saturday, March 4, 2006

Quite often, a person investigating the possibility of an annulment has a difficult time beginning the process. Those who help the person at a parish normally become the field advocate for that person's annulment investigation. This training, co-sponsored by the Center for Family Ministry and the Joliet Diocesan Tribunal, will provide potential "field advocates" and existing field advocates with pertinent information about the annulment process. It will also offer practical ways for the field advocate to assist, coach, and be spiritually supportive with the annulment petitioners.

Those who come to this training are selected and sent by their parish staff and, in turn, will serve their own parish in this ministry. The training takes place at St. Anne Parish in Crest Hill from 8:30 a.m.(check-in begins at 8:00) to 3:00 p.m. and will be conducted by Father Joseph Tapella, Deacon Bob Vavra, and Desirée Marciani, associate director of the Center for Family Ministry. There is no cost, but participants are asked to bring a brown bag lunch. Soft drinks and dessert will be provided.

Although the training is not mandatory, it will be very helpful, both for existing field advocates, and those who want to begin to reach out to annulment petitioners. For registration information, concerns, or questions, call Desirée Marciani at **815-838-5334**.

JOYFUL AGAIN!

JOYFUL AGAIN! is a two-day program for widows and widowers who want to resolve the grief they feel inside and begin to live again after the death of their spouse. The weekend employs a series of video presentations, followed by facilitated small group discussion and private reflection time. Through this process, individuals gain new insights and receive encouragement and support. Trained facilitators, who have been widowed themselves help with the weekend and the discussions.

The next weekend at the St. Charles Pastoral Center in Romeoville will be on March 4-5. The \$75.00 cost includes all meals and materials. Persons attending may stay overnight at the pastoral center for an additional fee of \$30, or may go home and return again for the second day.

Working on annulment papers alone without support can be emotionally painful, overwhelming, and frustrating. Papers often get shoved into a desk drawer and more often than not are never worked on again. In an effort to help petitioners complete the process, the Center for Family Ministry, in collaboration with the Joliet Diocesan Tribunal, is once again offering a Day of Support for Annulment Petitioners on **Saturday, February 18, 2006** from 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. at the St. Charles Pastoral Center.

This workshop is designed for divorced persons who have petitioned the Diocesan Marriage Tribunal to begin the annulment process, have submitted basic data for introduction of their case, but have not yet completed the Marriage Summary Questionnaire. Catholics and non-Catholics are welcome to attend, whether remarried or not.

The day will include a time of prayer, time for questions and input regarding annulments and the relational issues dealt with in the questionnaire. Participants will begin or continue filling out the questionnaire within a supportive environment. A team of pastoral ministers will be available for private consultation.
