Safe Environment for Children Touching Safety Instruction

Grades 9-12– using *Personal Safety Awareness (Boy Scouts)*

NOTE: When using this program, the diocesan requirement to fulfill the OCYP audit is to instruct students using the section entitled Internet Predators. The sections on Peer Harassment and Acquaintance Rape also recommended within the context of a youth ministry program, and may be used or adapted for use.

BEFORE THE LESSON

Today we are going to talk about keeping yourself safe from internet predators who make contact with young people in order to sexually abuse them. We in your school/religious education program and parish community want you to be safe because we care about you. As God's special creation, you deserve to be treated with care and respect.

Before we begin, let's pray for God to be with us today.

Have someone read aloud from a Bible: 1 Corinthians 3:16-17

Let us pray....(short silence)

God, you have made each of us in your image, temples of your Spirit,

And we know that each one of us is precious in your eyes.

We ask you to be here with us today

as we learn together how to protect ourselves.

Open our ears to hear what you wish us to know

Open our eyes to see what you wish to show us

Open our hearts to the possibilities of growth and understanding

that you wish us to experience today.

We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

VIEW THE DVD

Pause for discussion where indicated. Ask students to tell where they saw the signs of danger, etc. as indicated. Let students provide the impetus and direction for the discussion whenever possible. Talk about the internet safety tips provided on the DVD.

Remind students that internet safety and dealing with stalking situations are part of a larger personal safety scenario related to what they have learned in previous years about safe and unsafe touch. In this video, the girl did the right thing by telling someone, and that should lead to reporting the stalker to authorities.

AFTER THE LESSON

CLOSING PRAYER

Begin with a recording of appropriate youth-friendly music – suggestions:
